Dear Brothers,

After long waiting I received your letter of August 25 with joyfulness. However, I am very disappointed with your statement, "we wonder before the Lord whether such a meeting (with me in person) at this juncture will contribute to a resolution. " We are co-workers, we are brothers. Our fellowship should become very normal. Should there be issues, they should be dissolved according to Christ through a long process of sweet fellowship in Christ. Before the Lord I can testify that since the departure of Brother Lee I have contacted many of you brothers, especially brothers in southern California, many times, even though to my recollection I received no calls from any of you except dear brother Andrew. I always treasure the time we can fellowship together in person realizing this pleases our Lord and will eventually become profitable.

Dear brothers, I would still like to lay hold on your statement, "we love you, Titus, as a fellow servant in the Lord who shares a special bond with us... " I believe you brothers are honest, sincere God-men, and such a statement is real and is not written to be displayed to other readers besides me. I treasure your love and hope that it can be the seed that will eventually bind us together for the Lord's satisfaction. Such love should generate fellowship rather than business discussing. Here may I propose that some key brothers in southern California separate some times to pray with me and a few of my co-workers on a regular basis, so that we can enjoy the presence of the Lord, enjoy the presence of one another, and seek after the Lord's leading together.

In your letter you mentioned that certain contents of the articles written by Brother Frank Lin were directly contradicting Brother Lee's teaching and practice. I am eager to know from you what those contradictions are. To my recollection, Brother Frank Lin was the only one who worked and was entrusted directly by Brother Lee with the Truth lessons. Brother Lee even commented about him that he could have two doctor degrees in theology. Your specifics would be greatly appreciated by me as I can then in turn pass them on to Brother Lin. I am very concerned that your letter will also be passed out through whatever the channel and your ambiguous statement could damage Brother Lin's ministry.

Your question concerning an anonymous document, "Concerning the LSM Promulgation dated June 30, 2005 *Publication Work in the Lord & Recovery*," is unknown to me. I have no knowledge of this document. However, I do advise you brothers to consider it before the Lord, as our dear respected Brother Lee taught us that even if Satan points out our problems, we should take it before the Lord. I believe the writer must be a

brother among us and I wish, just as you do, he would have signed his name, just as I wish you brothers would sign your names clearly on your documents on publication.

Dear brothers, I am extremely concerned about you attacking Brother Nigel Tomes in your letter of September 27 and signed by the co-workers in Southern California, indicating that his writing is the “work of darkness and spreads spiritual death.” Dear brothers, do you mean that Brother Nigel is Satanic? I also have a copy of the document he produced and find nothing wrong in his attitude. He has not demanded that you brothers take back your publication document nor has he asked you brothers to repent. He, as a co-worker, has only spoken out what he has considered as truth and facts for all the co-workers to consider and fellowship. Must you brothers react in such a way that the enemy will have opportunity to attack the co-workers as a group and many of the dear saints?

I have passed on your word, concerning the churches here from your August 25 letter, to the leading ones in this area and asked them to realize your heart. Furthermore, I will be most willing to be a yoke-fellow with the “blending co-workers,” However, I still do not know how to “merge with the one direction of the one work in the Lord's one move for His one Body today.” His one Body is organic and not institutional. In turn, the Lord's one move must also be organic and not programmed. His work must also be organic and not institutional. I worship the Lord that we are one organically and I look to the Lord that this organic oneness can become our reality through our praying together.

I love you and await your arrangement that we could be together.
