

Dear brother Andrew and all the signatories of the letter addressed to the undersigned dated June 4, 2005.

With much grace I received and read your very weighty fellowship contained in your letter dated June 4. I'm extremely thankful that at the end of the letter you stated, "We are open to your fellowship toward a true resolution and restoration of our testimony of oneness as the primary item in the Lord's recovery today."

I have acknowledged various demands in your letter. You mention, "In our present case it would mean that you would join yourself and those co-workers loyal to you to the blending co-workers with the continuation of your previous work left to the fellowship of their coordinated oversight." Parallel to this statement you indicate that there are churches under my ministry. I also acknowledge your hope that "you could lead the other co-workers and the saints under your influence back...including the attending of the seven feasts." In turn I have passed on your letter to the key co-workers and leading ones in this area for them to pray before the Lord and consider these demands.

Dear brothers, with so many items you mentioned in this letter concerning me as well as the situation among us, I have a deep fear, even a trembling, that I may not understand you and may even misunderstand you. I am also very afraid that my response will not bring you to a full understanding. As the matters mentioned in your letter are so serious and sober, I beg you to grant me a time for some thorough, face to face fellowship with you over these matters and over your statement. I believe, as you stated that you are open to my fellowship, that this request can be granted. If it is impossible for all 21 of you to come together with me and a few of my co-workers, I hope I can meet with a few whom you all can trust.

Brothers, there is one statement that concerns me very much. You stated "you know that much more could be said in detail on this matter if you choose to dispute these facts." I do not know what you have in mind. As this letter can easily leak out and be read by many saints, this statement may sow seeds of suspicion. This may open the door for Satan to damage and discredit the co-workers as a whole, including their leaders. I hope we can present ourselves as men of God coordinating together, even though we all are fallible. Our enemy is Satan and not each other.
